On April 11 2015, Helping Strays, the Humane Society of Monroe County will host its 11th Annual A Cause for Paws Benefit, at The Falls in Columbia, Illinois. This benefit is our largest fundraiser of the year and a celebration of the tremendous accomplishments of the past year.

Prior to Helping Strays becoming involved 11 years ago, a majority of animals in the county pound were euthanized after five days. Still today, there are no other alternatives, no one to help the lost and abandoned animals if Helping Strays does not rescue them. In 2014, Helping Strays rescued and successfully adopted out over 430 animals, for a total of more than 3,100 animals in the past eleven years! All of these animals would otherwise have been euthanized at the county pound or died on the streets!

We are excited to announce that we have picked a contractor to build our new facility! This year we continue to focus on raising funds for the day-to-day operations of the shelter and veterinary care of all the animals. It has taken all of you to help see this goal accomplished. Thanks to you we should be in our new facility by the years end.

Helping Strays, a no-kill shelter, is a completely independent organization, NOT affiliated with any other humane society or group.
